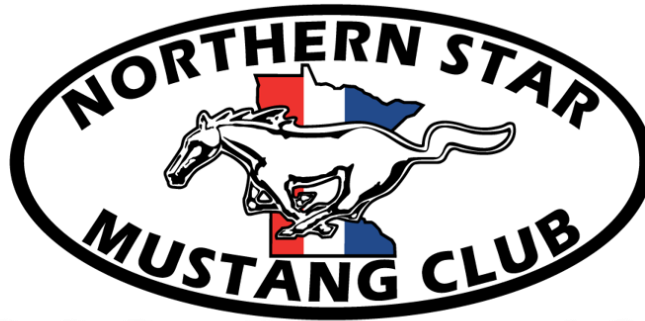

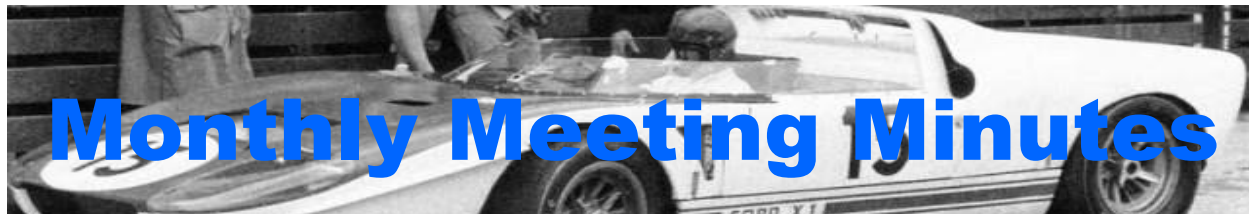

2024 Quilt of Valor

On behalf of the Northern Star Mustang Club, club members, Pam Flaten, Karen Greenwell, and, Carole Ackerman made this quilt to honor a veteran. The long arm quilting was donated by Angie Roberts at The Noble Quilter. This is the 7th annual quilt which they have made and donated. These members of the Northern Star Mustang club are happy to do their little part to support and encourage our veterans.

This year the recipient of this quilt of Valor is Nyle La Grange.

Sergeant La Grange served as a fuels specialist and combat defense resource in the United States Air Force from 1966 – 1972. His work fueling bombers, tankers and fighters required the handling of volatile compounds that resulted in his poisoning and led to his current status as a disabled veteran.

His term of service was with the 42nd Bomb Wing of the 8th Air Force, with home base off the North Atlantic coast on the U.S/ Canadian Border. Their nuclear bombardment mission focused on key targets within Russia. Protecting America required these brave men to execute a dangerous maneuver to launch all bombers within 11 minutes and another 8 minutes to live, because they were a priority Russian nuclear target, in the event of an attack.

Nyle, we thank you for your service. It is an honor to present you with this quilt of valor, on behalf of the Northern Star Mustang Club.

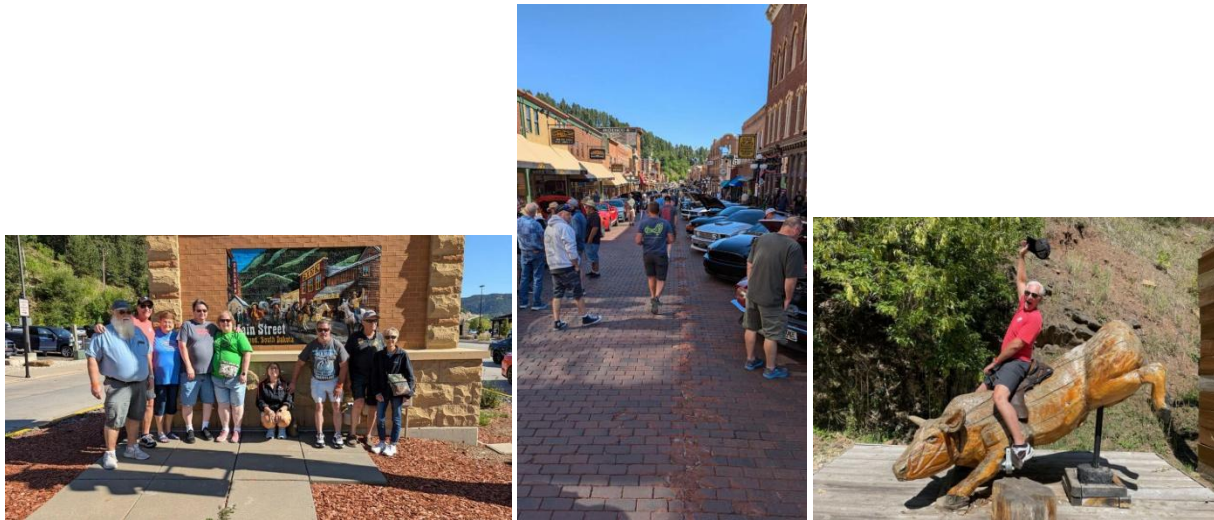

The first day was all about getting there with a stop at the Dignity of Earth and Sky, Serenity Statue in Chamberlain SD on a bluff overlooking the Missouri River and several other food and gas pit stops. Arrived at the Thunderdome to check in and catch some dinner at the local Brewery. After an 11 hour travel day, we settled in at the house we rented pretty much hit the sack.



Wednesday was a sleep in morning for most. Kurt was registered to participate in the morning session of the BF Goodrich Autocross Driving School at the Thunderdome. At the September 15th All-Makes Car Show at Apple Ford Shakopee, the club gave \$3,000 to Every Meal. Every Meal prepares and delivers meals to needy Minnesota children on non-school days. About 1.7 Million meals were delivered last year. Every Meal representative Jan Kruchoski attended the show and accepted the check on their behalf.



Charities so far this year: \$6,000 (+\$3,000 match) to Every Meal, \$500 to Apple Valley HS Music Dept, \$500 to Magnus Veterans

The Charity Committee met on September 23 to plan the donations for the rest of the year. We have three items to be voted on at the October club meeting:

- 1) Continue the support of the Ford Asset automotive program at Hennepin Technical College. The program is a two-year internship program where the students alternate time at an auto service provider and time at taking classes at the college. For several years, we have been donating \$2250 to provide three Northern Mustang Club Scholarships (\$750 each) to three students in the program. We propose to increase that amount to \$2400 (three students at \$800 each). We also want to invite the students to attend one of our car shows where we can encourage their career.
- 2) Start providing Northern Mustang Club Scholarships to the automotive program at Dakota County Technical College. Their program is also an internship program. Our show benefactor, Apple Ford, is a sponsor of the program and recently donated a truck to it. We can support a scholarship at DCTC in our name if we commit to a total donation greater than \$5000, distributed over three years. We propose to provide \$5400 over the next three years to provide one \$900 scholarship for each of the six semesters during that time (6 x \$900 = \$5400). This year we would like to pay \$2700 to provide for the next three semesters. The remaining \$2700 can be provided in smaller payments over the next two years. We also want to invite these students to attend one of our car shows.
- 3) Choose an organization to receive our remaining charity dollars (amount TBD). Here are three charities we would like to consider but will want to choose only one. We would rather give \$1,000 to \$2,000 to one charity rather than give a few hundred dollars to each. Last year we gave \$2,975 to Alexandria House.
 - Alexandra House (Blaine MN, \$4M) -- Empowers victims of domestic and sexual violence, and inspire social change through education, support and advocacy.
 - Wishes and More (Minneapolis MN, \$2M) -- Grants wishes and scholarships of hope for Minnesota kids (<19 yrs) with a terminal or life-threatening condition, often outdoor sports related

- Magnus Veterans (Dayton MN, \$1M) -- Welcoming community of members, health specialists, and volunteers working together to provide a comprehensive approach to veteran well-being (580 patient members)

Proposal: \$2,400 to Hennepin Tech College, \$2,700 to Dakota County Tech College, remaining charity dollars to Alexandra House, Wishes & More, or Magnus Veterans

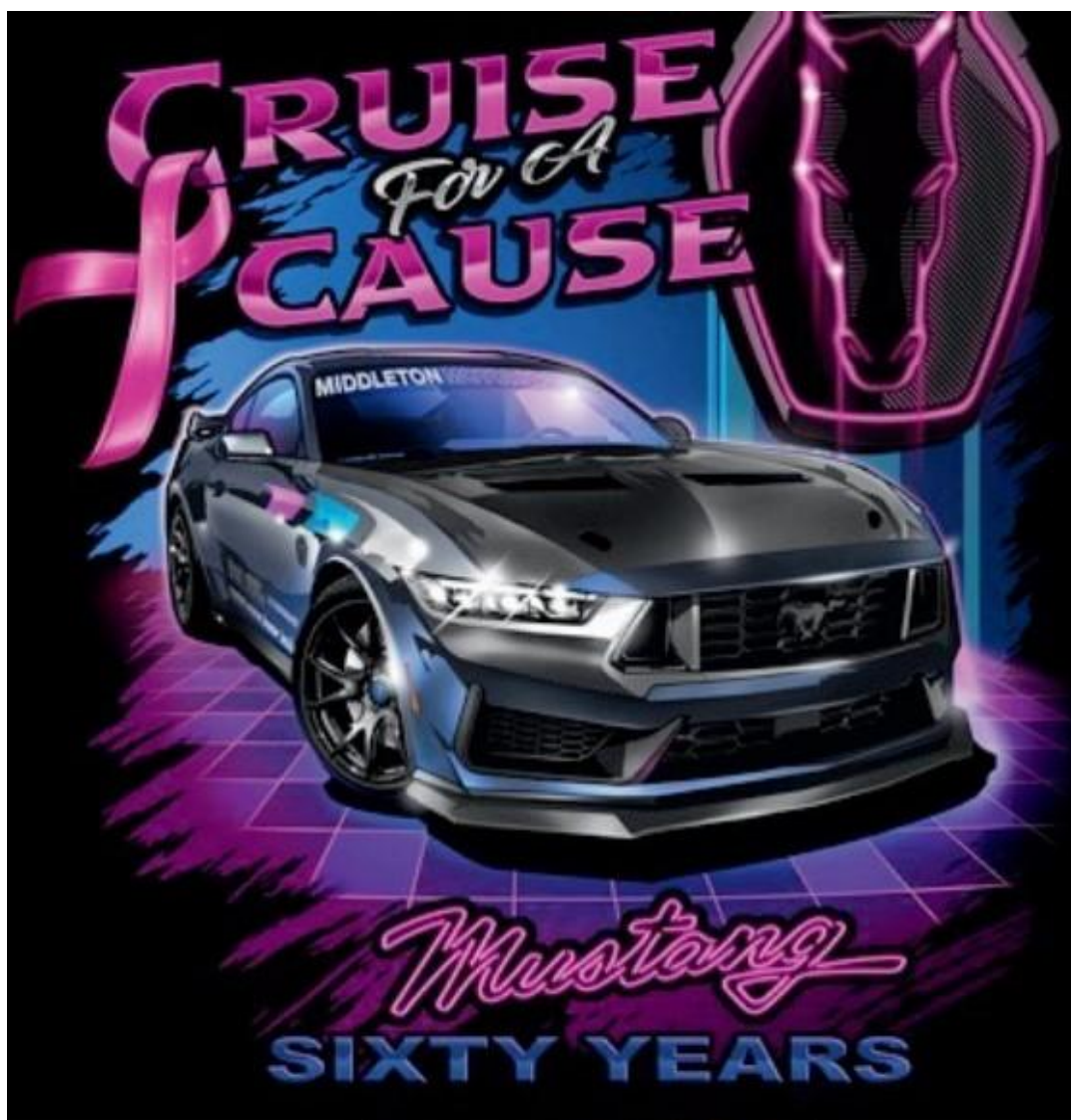
MCA Treasurer Al Hammond reported our bank accounts as follows:

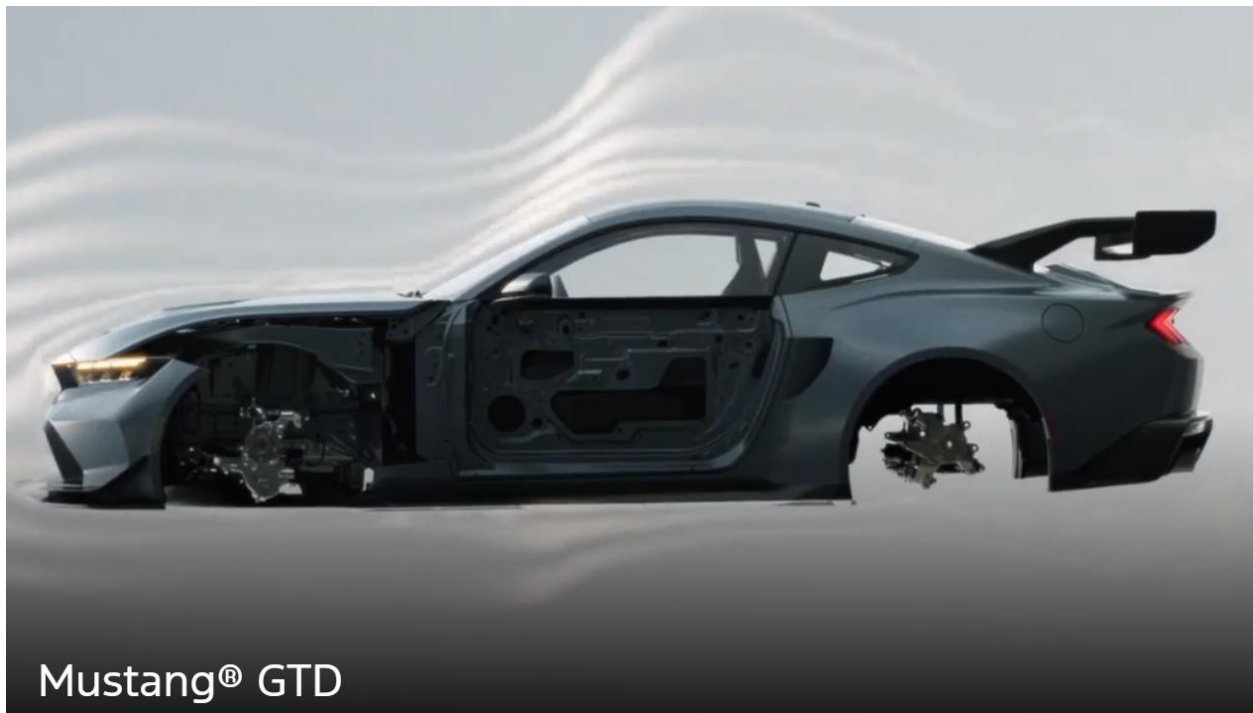
